A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR HEATHER KISTNER



The old saying goes: *"The church is always one generation away from extinction."*

Typically, we use that sort of "fear leverage" to double-down on attractional ministries for children and youth. I've heard ministry leaders use the "one generation" mantra to argue for the importance of church/parachurch-based ministries. But I've never heard it used to undergird our essential mission—encouraging, equipping, and resourcing the most important faith-forming agents we have: **Parents.**

The Real Unsung Heroes

Over the last 50 years or so the Christian church has been in profound decline in the United States. That's not new news. And yet, in this same period of time, we have watched the church—both congregations and parachurch organizations—focus on children and youth LIKE NEVER BEFORE IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY.

So here we are. Why hasn't all of this focused attention moved the needle?

We love to sing the praises of unsung saints in the church. More often than not, we're spotlighting the wonderful (and I mean wonderful!) people who quietly show up week after week to make the coffee, quilt the quilts, and visit shut-ins. But my experience with our Fourth-Soil Parenting project has re-emphasized the importance of unsung-hero parents in our congregations—often maligned for their misplaced priorities and biblical illiteracy.

Three Types of Parents Worth Cheering

Our overlooked unsung heroes are juggling work with home responsibilities, personal Uber-driving, medical triage, financial management, crisis intervention, and, well, influencing their children toward an everyday relationship with God. Their plate is heaping... That's why these three types of parents deserve our praise and honor...

1. Moms and dads who publicly share their stories. Research has been done on the most important fishing-ponds—Facebook and Instagram. And I've discovered an amazing pool of parents (not churches!) actively resourcing each other through conversation and ideas as they try to raise their children with a vibrant faith in Jesus. While many of them are regularly attending churches, they do not expect the church to raise their children in the faith *for them*. They also know that they need others and can't do this job alone. And they are finding community in the places that are accessible to them. Thank God.

2. Moms and dads who don't give up the keys. At a church in Nashville, they intentionally have no youth group and minimal children's programming on a typical Sunday. And when the research team asked the former youth minister about why they choose a church like this when there are so MANY flashier options literally right down the street. He said: "I don't mind if my kids want to attend a youth group somewhere for the friendships. But I don't ever want to give up the keys of their formation to that."

3. *Moms and dads who bring the messiness of our world home.* We're learning about parents' willingness to engage in the hard realities of raising kids in our world. We are amazed what we've learned by listening to parents about their lives and concerns. Under the surface of what looks like families whose priorities don't include church we've found families who serve together, find quality time together, talk with their children about their faith, and bring foster children into their lives. Our churches are also discovering a pervasive loneliness among parents and a longing for a depth of faith to ground them and their family life. It all looks different than it did a generation ago.

Let's look around for the unsung saints in our community. People who drive minivans littered with Cheerios. People who often don't sit at tables for dinners. Let's let them know you see them and love how they're helping their children love Jesus. They are the ones who can keep church from extinction.

Lenten Journey “Again & Again; Lenten Refrain”

In Lent, we're reminded again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again. And yet, in the midst of our chaotic lives, God offers a sacred refrain: “I choose you, I love you, I will lead you.” (John 15) Again and again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward.



This theme provides a clear invitation in a time when much is unclear. Worshiping together or apart, God comes to us again and again and hears our prayers, our dreams, our hopes, and our doubts. Our sub-title, *A Lenten Refrain*, speaks to the ways God can make music of our lives. “Refrain” also reminds us that Lent is a season of abstaining from certain practices in order to take on new rhythms and habits.

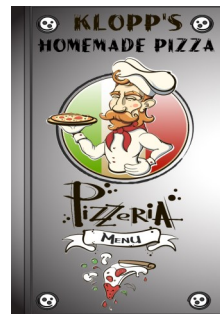

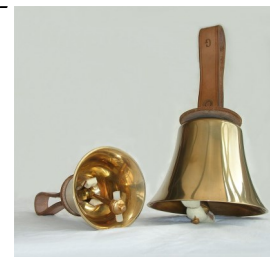

DEDUCTIBLE AND NON-DEDUCTIBLE GIVING

Charitable giving continues to evolve each year with different organizations and financial instruments available to the giver. One that you may have heard of as a means to direct money to charitable institutions is a **Donor Advised Fund (DAF)**. Contributing to a DAF provides the giver with a tax deduction in the year the money is deposited in the fund. After that, the giver may direct money from the fund at any time to a charitable organization like Trinity. However the subsequent donation to the church from the DAF is **not** a tax deductible donation, as the tax benefit was already realized at the time the money was initially directed to the fund.

Taxable and non-taxable donations will be identified separately on your Trinity year-end donation statement. Most charitable donations to a 501(c)(3) organization such as Trinity are tax deductible and unless otherwise notified, Trinity will treat them as such. If you have questions about a contribution that you are planning to make or have made to Trinity please contact the church office. If you have questions about giving to charitable donations and the tax consequences, please consult your tax preparer.

Additionally, we are including an article from the September 2021 Trumpet on another type of charitable giving – stock donations:

Stock Donations to Trinity may offer tax benefit over after-tax cash donations but present challenges for our church, like handling stock transfer and valuation at the time of giving. We now have a referral arrangement with Thrivent Financial. With Thrivent's faith background, they have a system in place to manage church donations. Thrivent will assist members with processing the stock transaction[1]valuation and using a Donor Advised Fund, where members can direct gifts to charities at their discretion.

REDUCING HUNGER AND IMPROVING HEALTH

During February and March, our Mission Outreach focus will be improved health for those whose resources and access to food, health care supplies and services are limited. WELCA will coordinate the collection of items for Personal Care Kits and accept monetary gifts for ELCA World Hunger.

Personal care kits will be distributed through Lutheran World Relief. A Thrivent Action Team will be formed to provide towels and set up an event to pack kit supplies. Other items needed for the kits are: a toothbrush, 2 bath size bars of soap (preferably low in scent), a wide-toothed comb, and nail clippers. We hope to assemble at least 50 kits.



40 DAYS OF GIVING

Our Lenten offering to ELCA World Hunger will be designated this year to the Health Care category of Good Gifts and will provide supplies and services where most needed. Your gift may be given through WELCA in envelopes provided, or you can give to ELCA World Hunger through Trinity's online options. Donations given until Easter will be put toward this special project.

Through ELCA Good Gifts Health, small gifts add up to large impacts. \$10 can provide a mosquito net or a children's clinic visit, \$25 can provide food for a child for a month, personal protective equipment for health workers, or hygiene kits for households, schools, clinics and other public spaces. \$30 can provide immunizations for a child and protect the health of others as well. \$75 can provide supplies for a health clinic for a week. Diagnostic tests, antibiotics and treatments for common illnesses are among the basic supplies every clinic needs to treat patients and save lives. \$300 provides nutrition for a child for a year. Foods high in protein and vitamins help keep tummies full and immune systems strong. Your support shows children who have lost one or both parents that someone cares.

Thank you for your ongoing gifts that support Trinity's mission outreach to the world through the ELCA and Lutheran World Relief.
